A MESSAGE FROM OUR CEO

On June 10, 2016 Family Tree celebrated 40 years of service to our community. Begin-

ning in Jefferson County with services for abused and neglected children and victims of domestic violence, we have evolved to fill gaps in the community, both programmatically and geographically. Today our mission is to help people overcome child abuse, domestic violence and homelessness to become safe, strong and self-reliant and we proudly serve the entire metro Denver region.

The issues we address are interconnected and Family Tree is uniquely positioned to address these issues. We help people find strengths – often those they don't know they have – to empower them to overcome these crises and traumas to improve their economic independence, and to create lasting positive change in their lives.

Despite the breadth of our service array, we do not do this work alone: standing on the shoulders of others who built this strong organization, and with many partners in the community. Individuals, companies, government, non-profit and foundation partners, civic and faith based organizations have all come together to make positive change in our community.

Over four decades, as a team and with our partners, we've honed and improved our services to heighten the positive impact in our community.

Last year:

We had a nearly 90% success rate helping DV victims increase their safety, and that of their children.

More than 80% of households moved into safe and permanent housing, after exiting Homelessness Program.

82% of at-risk children were successfully diverted from child welfare and court involvement. Of those diverted, 97% were still safely in their home 12 months later.

Helping our clients achieve this level of success is why we do this work.

Their courage and perseverance helps

inspire them to change their lives. Along with vital, empowering help from the Family Tree team they are able to achieve their goals. These passionate Family Tree team members do very difficult work every day, and believe all people deserve a chance to create better lives for themselves; lives free of abuse, neglect, and violence; and lives enhanced by safety, security and economic independence; and a safe place to call home.

Forty years is no small feat but we're not looking back, we're looking ahead at a future focused on empowering people in our community to help them transform their lives. To continue to do this, we will evolve our interconnected service model to an integrated service model, while honoring the centers of excellence each of our programs have become. We will adapt to the changing funding climate, working to build revenues that recognize and support an integrated, multipleservice and multi-generational approach, so we can help our neighbors and citizens who need help the most.

But we do all of this with the ultimate goal of helping transform our community as a whole – one life, and one family at a time.



INTERCONNECTED ISSUES...INTERCONNECTED SOLUTIONS

Family Tree works with vulnerable people located throughout the seven-county metro Denver region. Our clients have histories of poverty, trauma, and/or crises, most of whom are family units (64%) and the majority of these are female headed households (67%), with 74% of our clients reporting income under \$20,000 annually.



CHILD & YOUTH SERVICES

Family Tree's Child and Youth Services provide safety and stability for children, infants, and youth who have been abused or neglected, are at risk of childhood abuse or neglect, or are not safe in their homes.

Programs include:


SafeCare

SafeCare is a voluntary parent support program that supports, mentors, and empowers parents and caregivers to increase their skills in the topic-areas of parent-child interactions, home safety, and child health.

Kinship Programs

Kinship case managers provide home-based supportive services, referrals, and financial assistance to help relative caretakers provide safe and stable housing for children in their care.





Community Family Resource Team

CFRT provides individual therapy for youth at risk of out-of-home placement, as well as family therapy and case management to help stabilize the families, improve family functioning, and keep youth in their homes.





HOUSING AND FAMILY STABILIZATION SERVICES

Serves individuals and families who are experiencing homelessness or who are at-risk of homelessness.

Services include:

- House of Hope residential program for homeless women with children (up to 90 days)
- Hotline assistance providing limited case management, information, and linkages to community resources
- Intensive, home-based case management services
- Financial assistance for homeless prevention including rental subsidies, deposits, and utilities
- Self-sufficiency and independent living classes
- Housing navigation services
- Individualized goal setting to overcome barriers to self-sufficiency
- Education and employment counseling
- Referrals to community resources such as mental health providers, substance use programs, health and wellness









Family Tree's Domestic Violence Services assist adult and child victims of domestic violence, sexual assault and stalking; families who have experienced divorce or separation; and children who have witnessed family violence and/or have experienced abuse in their homes.

Women In Crisis

To keep victims safe from domestic violence by providing a 24-hour crisis line, emergency residential services, safety planning, advocacy, community resources, health care, and other supportive services.

Legal Advocacy Program

The purpose of the Family Tree Legal Advocacy Program is to increase immediate and long-term safety for survivors of domestic violence, sexual assault, and stalking by providing civil and criminal legal advocacy, crisis intervention, and information and referrals.

Domestic Violence Outreach Program

Family Tree's Domestic Violence Outreach Program provides individual advocacy and group support to survivors of domestic violence. Family

Tree's Domestic Violence Outreach Program provides professional training and education on how to recognize domestic violence and support those experiencing abuse.

Parenting Time Program

Supervised Parenting Time provides trained personnel to supervise contact between a child and his/her non-residential parent.


Family Tree Parenting Time Program also provides a safe and comfortable place for children to wait for contact with the non-residential parent.






